




# 2019 Project Clean Sweep

**T**he City of Show Low is sponsoring the 21st annual **Project Clean Sweep**, our popular and successful beautification program. We can help you rid your property of unwanted items, green waste and abandoned vehicles to make it more fire-safe and attractive. **Participation in the program is FREE to those presenting proof of residency—either a *City of Show Low utility bill showing CURRENT REFUSE SERVICE* or a *valid driver's license listing a physical address within the city limits.***

As in previous years, construction materials and hazardous materials (liquid paints, oils, pesticides, herbicides and household cleaning products) are strictly prohibited. In addition, **commercial businesses are excluded from the program.**

This year again features two weeks of free green waste dumping, giving you extra time to clean your property. Components of the program are provided in different weeks, as described below:

- ❖ Green waste dumping – Monday, May 13, through Saturday, May 18, and Monday, May 20, through Saturday, May 25 (this free service is limited to these specially-designated weeks)
- ❖ Bulky item pick up – Monday, June 3, through Friday, June 7 (picked up on your *regular scheduled trash collection day*)
- ❖ Lone Pine transfer station – Monday, June 3, through Saturday, June 8
- ❖ Abandoned vehicles – contact salvage companies directly to make arrangements



**Proof of residency is required to participate in Project Clean Sweep. You must present a City of Show Low utility statement showing **CURRENT REFUSE SERVICE** or a valid driver's license listing a physical address within the city limits.**

**Green Waste Dumping** (offered for TWO weeks!)  
Between **8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.** from **Monday, May 13 through Saturday, May 18, and Monday, May 20, through Saturday, May 25**, drop off **green waste** for free at Dirty Deeds Green Waste, located at 890 Cinder Pit Road off of US 60 (behind Perkins Cinders) (*see map on next page*). Bring proof of your residency to participate.

To get to Dirty Deeds, head east on US 60 approximately two miles past SR 77 (Penrod Road) to North First Knoll Drive, make a turn and head south approximately 0.3 mile and take a right on Cinder Pit Road. The road ends at 890 Cinder Pit Road.

Pine needles, tree limbs, grass clippings and organic materials are accepted. Make sure there is no garbage, plastic, rocks, dirt, glass or other trash mixed in with the green waste. Also accepted are wood products, including pallets, treated/untreated lumber and painted/unpainted lumber. Direct any questions to Rick Austin at (928) 532-4100.

## **Bulky Item Pickup**

City employees collect bulky items, such as large appliances (empty refrigerators or freezers of all contents before placing at curbside), furniture, tires, etc., at no charge on your *regular scheduled trash collection day* **Monday, June 3, through Friday, June 7, from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.** Residents are NOT required to schedule a pick-up. Place your items in front of your residence next to the roadway by 7:00 a.m. City staff follows the Waste Management route schedule.

We encourage you to take advantage of dropping off green waste for free at Dirty Deeds between May 13 and May 18

and/or May 20 through May 25 (see map, right, or previous page for written directions). If you do put out green waste for pick-up, **branches and limbs must be less than 4 feet long and bundled.**

## Lone Pine Transfer Station

Take your items (and proof of residency) to the Lone Pine Transfer Station north of Show Low, west of SR 77 on Lone Pine Dam Road (see map), and dump them at no charge between **Monday, June 3, through Saturday, June 8, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (closed noon to 12:30 p.m.).**

Materials from construction sites or commercial debris will be charged standard rates. In addition, under no circumstances will the transfer station accept hazardous materials, automobile batteries and tires with or without rims.

## Abandoned Vehicles


Salvage companies will pay cash for inoperable vehicles—with or without a title—and will haul them away at no charge to you. Contact S&D Auto Wrecking at (928) 537-7132 or Show Low Auto Sales at (928) 537-2911 to make the necessary arrangements.

## Additional Programs

The city also offers **free excess trash collection service** six times a year. This service, available to all City of Show Low refuse customers, is provided by Waste Management on your *regular scheduled collection day* during the first full week of odd-numbered months. The next available dates are **July 8 to 11, September 9 to 12, and November 4 to 7** (excess trash weeks are moved to the next week when any service day falls on an observed holiday). Excess trash must be bagged, boxed or bundled; is limited to normal household items; should not exceed 50 pounds per single item; and is limited to the equivalent of one pick-up load (4x4x8 feet) or about 20 bags. Items must be placed at the curbside either the night before pick up or by 6 a.m. the day of. Information is also available at [showlowaz.gov](http://showlowaz.gov).

Furniture, mattresses, refrigerators and freezers are not accepted by Waste Management as part of the excess trash collection program. Call (928) 532-4005 during Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. with questions about this city benefit.

The city also provides convenient curbside recycling pickup on your *regular scheduled collection day*, with one large bin for recyclables. Items accepted for recycling include magazines; paper; brown paper bags; newspapers; cardboard; dairy and juice containers; phone books; plastic bottles and containers (nos. 1-7); aluminum foil and cans; tin or steel cans. Items NOT accepted for recycling are plastic bags, plastic wrap, shredded paper, foam cups/containers, glass, food waste, green waste, films and food-soiled cardboard or paper goods, such as pizza boxes.

Take advantage of Project Clean Sweep—a FREE, once-a-year opportunity to clean your property of excess trash and yard debris. Let's all do our part to keep Show Low clean and attractive and to show our community pride!
