Free excess garbage collection

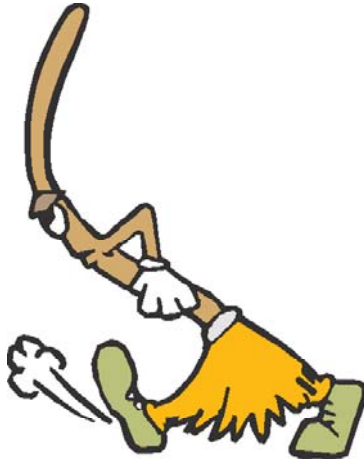
Waste Management is providing free excess trash collection **May 31 through June 3**. The next collections are September 6 through 9, November 15 through 18 and December 27 through 30.

Abandoned vehicles

Residents who submit the required abandoned vehicle form by **Friday, June 4** will have their inoperable vehicle towed by a towing company contracted by the city. Inoperable vehicles with or without a title will be accepted for \$50 per vehicle. However, untitled vehicles will be assessed a charge from the Department of Motor Vehicles, applied to the owner's DMV record. To avoid DMV fees, you may get a replacement title from DMV prior to submitting your vehicle for towing.

Show Low Days: classic cars, arts & crafts, fun!

Join the fun at the 7th annual Show Low Days, scheduled for June 4, 5 and 6 at Show Low City Park, 1100 W. Deuce of Clubs. Sponsored by the Show Low Chamber of Commerce, this is the largest, free admission, arts, crafts and car show in Show Low, attracting over 10,000 attendees every year. Take the family and enjoy the Still Cruisin' the Deuce car show, arts and crafts festival, the newly added Business Expo and local entertainment. Companion events are the fly-in pancake breakfast at Show Low Regional Airport, east of town on US60, and a golf tournament at Silver Creek Golf Course, both on Saturday.

Show Low Days runs Friday from noon to 5 p.m., Saturday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. A highlight of the three-day event is a parade of classic cars on Friday, June 4, from 4 to 5 p.m.

Classic car enthusiasts will enjoy strolling among the 30 different car classes on view at City Park. Up to 250 cars will be on display, with awards for first and second places in each class. Arts and crafts lovers can choose from a wide array of handmade crafts, fine arts, vendors and food booths.



Aircraft enthusiasts will enjoy the fly-in pancake breakfast hosted by the Experimental Aircraft Association Chapter 586 on Saturday from 7 to 10 a.m. Breakfast will be served for \$5 for adults, \$3 for children 12 years of age and under, and free to men and women in military uniform. Free transportation to and from City Park will be provided. Proceeds go toward promoting general aviation. Introduce your child, ages 8 to 17, to aviation with free Young Eagle airplane rides until 10 a.m. A parent or guardian must be present.

Or if golfing is your pleasure, tee off at 8 a.m. in the scramble golf tournament on Saturday, sponsored by the White Mountain Submarine Veterans. Registration is \$80 per player, with the tournament limited to 120 players.

Council members take seats at June 1 meeting

Three Council members elected in the city's 2010 primary election will be sworn in at the June 1 regular meeting. Mike Allsop, Gene Kelley and John Leech, Jr. will each serve four-year terms. The meeting, open to the public, begins at 7 p.m. in the City Council Chambers, 180 N. 9th Street. The meeting will be televised live via City 4 Television (cable channel 4) and is also Webcast at www.showlowaz.gov.

be accepted at the public works yard, 1281 E. Thornton. (A list of acceptable items can be found online at showlowaz.gov in the May 2010 newsletter.) All other items will be turned away. Residents will be asked to provide proof of Show Low residency so bring a current city utility statement.

Batteries and automobile tires with rims will be accepted for \$1 each. Automobile tires without rims will also be accepted but no cash given. We no longer accept televisions and electronic equipment. Take them instead to a free city-sponsored electronic waste recycling event in August, with details provided in upcoming newsletters.

Free bulky item pickup

City employees will collect bulky items on your normally scheduled pickup day from **Monday, June 14, through Thursday, June 17, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.** Place your bulky items next to your polycart on your usual collection day by 7 a.m. City staff will follow the Waste Management route schedule. Large appliances, furniture, tires, etc. will be accepted, but no hazardous materials (liquid paints, oils, pesticides, herbicides, household cleaning products) nor any building materials will be accepted. Unlike "Cash for Trash," you will not be paid for these items.

Free dumping at transfer station

Take your items to the Lone Pine Transfer Station at no charge from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., **June 14 (Monday) through June 18 (Saturday)**. Bring proof of residency, such as a current City of Show Low water or sewer utility statement; otherwise, you will be charged dumping fees.

Free dumping does NOT apply to debris and materials from construction sites or commercial refuse, although the transfer station will accept them for a fee. In no circumstances will the transfer station accept hazardous materials (pesticides, herbicides, oils, liquid paints and household cleaning products), automobile batteries and tires with rims.
